



ORANGE LINE NORTH QUARTER



AREAS SERVED:

The Orange Line North Quarter connects Livingston Street, Magnolia Avenue, Marks Street, Orange Avenue, the Orange County Courthouse, and LYNX Central Station/SunRail. Transfers to the Orange Line are available at the Orange County Courthouse Station.

SERVICE FEATURES:

- 1.81 - miles
- 3 stations (all have electronic kiosks)
- 20 - minute service throughout the day, evenings, weekends, and holidays
- Operating hours:
Mon. - Thurs. - 6 a.m. - 10:45 p.m.
Friday - 6 a.m. - 12 a.m.
Saturday - 10 a.m. - 12 a.m.
Sunday - 10 a.m. - 10 p.m.
- Dedicated bus lanes on 19% of the route
- Traffic signal priority
- 2 buses during peak hours

HISTORY:

- The Orange Line North Quarter originally began as an extension to the Orange Line on April 19, 2015.
- Service began operating as a separate variation of the Orange Line termed, "North Quarter," on January 24, 2016.

FUNDING:

- Funded by the City of Orlando's Downtown Development Board and Parking Division.
- The annual operating cost (FY-18) is approximately \$368,432.85.

FY-18 RIDERSHIP:

- Average weekly ridership is 116 people.
- Average monthly ridership is 3,437 people.
- Average annual ridership is 41,243 people.
